BRIEF DESCRIPTION	The Nevada Museum of Art feature exhibitions showcase national and international artists while the permanent collection of nineteenth through twenty-first century art is divided into five focus collections linked by an overall emphasis on art and environment. Located in Reno, and designed by architect Will Bruder, the Donald W. Reynolds Center for the Visual Arts – E. L. Wiegand Gallery became the new facility for the Museum in May 2003. With its torqued exterior wall, suspended atrium staircase and views of Reno’s skyline, as well as the Sierra Nevada, the building is recognized as one of the most distinguished architectural achievements in the state.
