Simon Hogan has painted many versions of the Seven Sisters story (*Minyma Tjuta*), an important Aboriginal Dreaming story told across Australia. This painting situates the story at a rock hole (*Yalli*). At the top of this painting is *Nyirru* (Cheeky Old Man), who camps while watching the seven sisters. He awaits an opportunity to kidnap one.

The story of the Seven Sisters (the stellar constellation Pleiades) being chased by a man (the stellar constellation of Orion) is common to many cultures worldwide.

Lawrence Pennington is a "senior initiated man" born in the 1930s, before Spinifex people had contact with Western civilization. He grew up as a traditional huntergatherer and has what is now an unusual knowledge of country that is both profoundly physical and spiritual. He often paints the Pukara waterhole, a major men's site in Two Men Dreaming, an important story about two snake men. The waterhole is where the two, a father and son, lived. The son, before he was properly initiated, ambushed and ate some of the local people. The survivors insisted that the father take him away to be properly taught. That story and the subsequent adventures of the two snake men, which are credited with creating many of the landforms in Spinifex Country, are often the subject of paintings by senior men.
