Tal Shochat is a Tel Aviv-based artist whose father is Persian (originally from Iran), and whose mother's ancestral roots are Polish. Pomegranate Tree and Persian Carpet could be interpreted as an homage to her Persian roots. Pomegranate trees have been cultivated in the Mediterranean region for millennia, and they are thought to originate in present-day Iran and Afghanistan. Shochat uses the Persian carpet as a backdrop to separate the tree from its natural habitat, blurring the boundaries between inside and outside, nature and artifice.

Tal Shochat has created an on-going body of photographs focused on her family and her diverse cultural identity. Family Film (2017) was filmed at the site of a former immigrant camp near Hadera, a city located in the Haifa District of Israel. The video opens with footage of the artist's parents on a horse-driven cart—her mother wears a fanciful headdress and her father is shirtless and stoic. On the back of this cart is Mona, the artist's young daughter, followed by a group of people of different ages and ethnicities. Some wear costumes designed by the artist and others carry animals or other props. The artist describes this scene as a requiem, or funeral, for her parents. The diverse procession also represents migration and her family's blended Israeli, European, Eastern, and Asian roots.

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
