THE CENTER FOR ART + ENVIRONMENT

Prior to the pandemic lockdown in March, the Center for Art + Environment hosted 18 visiting researchers from across the United States who used 2 archives and a class that asked for a general tour of the Center. The Center acquired thirteen new archives, the most notable of which was the *Judy Chicago: Dry Ice, Smoke, and Fireworks* collection of her "Atmospheres" performance sculptures that spans 1967 to the present.

The Center also acquired 169 library books, five of which were placed into Special Collections. The Center began to focus on the donation of specialized libraries, the most notable additions of which were the history of daguerreotype photography, and from noted Canadian anthropologist Marvin Cohodas the histories of Guatemalan dance and Mayan weavings.

In 2018 he created and installed the Upside Down Church a 1:20 (7' tall) scale replica of a 19th century Midwest style church, pulled, upside down by 1:3 (2' tall) scale figures of the artist next to a 19th-century tailings pile in Virginia City, NV, In 2019, Shear repurposed some of Upside Down Church's materials to create Westward Expansion, a sculpture installed at the UC Berkeley Sagehen Creek Research Station, this church (right side up, this time) is being pulled by smaller figures seemingly down into the earth itself.
