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RODRIGO CASS'S FIRST SOLO U.S. MUSEUM EXHIBITION OPENS AT NEVADA MUSEUM OF ART

Reno, Nev. (September 3, 2025) – The Nevada Museum of Art is proud to present the first solo museum exhibition in the United States by interdisciplinary Brazilian artist **Rodrigo Cass** (b. 1983), on view **October 4 - November 2, 2025**. Rooted in 20th century Brazilian modernist movements and shaped by nearly a decade of monastic life, Cass's art is both physical and spiritual. His is the latest exhibition in the visiting artist series hosted by esteemed art collectors and patrons Pamela Joyner and Fred Giuffrida.

Working in a unique medium of concrete blended with pure pigment, Cass manipulates the concrete into a paint-like substance. He applies the mixture to linen, and creates textured, richly colored surfaces that invite viewers to explore the intersections of line, color, shape, and perception. His works offer a contemplative counterpoint to the purely formal concerns of geometric abstraction, instead channeling a sense of mysticism and poetic inquiry. Cass considers concrete to be the synthesis of his artistic mindset: a spiritual element, living and breathing.

From 2000 to 2008, Cass lived as a monk in the Carmelite order in southeastern Brazil—a formative chapter that continues to shape his artistic vision. His early video works documented repetitive gestures with everyday objects, echoing the meditative rhythms of monastic life. This exhibition builds upon those early explorations, bringing together geometric shapes in diverse media to create an immersive environment, and creating a spatial and emotional journey for inner reflection.

"Cass's work offers a space for viewers to slow down, look closely, and experience the quiet power of abstraction," said Apsara DiQuinzio, senior curator at the Nevada Museum of Art. "His unique material process, exploration of color, combined with a contemplative approach transforms the gallery into a resonant place of vibrant poetry."

On October 4, 2025, at 6 pm, the Museum will host an unforgettable evening with Cass who will do a special performance, followed by a public talk to between Rodrigo Cass and Amanda

Carneiro, curator at the Museu de Arte de São Paulo (MASP) and artistic organizer of the 60th international Art Exhibition, La Biennale di Venezia. As a prelude to the event, artist Paulo Von Poser will enact a performance with a drone.

Rodrigo Cass (b. 1983, Brazil) lives and works in São Paulo. In 2006 he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Plastic Arts at the Faculdade Santa Marcelina in São Paulo and studied Philosophy and Theology at the Faculdade Jesuíta in Belo Horizonte from 2007 to 2008.

Rodrigo Cass was a monk in the Carmelite Religious Order of São Paulo from 2000 to 2008 where he learned to paint Byzantine religious icon paintings with tempera paint. Influenced by philosophy and art history, Cass utilizes painting, sculpture, and video to explore the concreteness of things – extracting the color, texture, weight, function, and movement (or lack thereof) of concrete to manifest the formal language of his expression.
